



## List of Classes

### What classes can I enter?

All the classes are set out below, so please do have a good look through, and we hope that there will be something to tempt you to take part!

Please do read the requirements carefully: it would be disappointing for your brilliant produce to be disqualified for a simple mistake. So here are a few top tips to help you have the best chance of winning:

- Do check how many of each item is required.
- Think about the appearance: try to display exhibits of a similar size and shape, and present them as attractively as possible.
- The tops of onions should be dressed by tying or whipping.
- Root vegetables should have at least 75mm (3") of tops left on.
- Tomatoes should have stalks left on.
- All fruit should have stalks left on.

## Vegetable Classes

1. **Newcastle Challenge Cup:** 2 pot leeks 150mm (6") to tight button.

**Prize money for this class will be: 1st £100, 2nd £75, 3rd £50.**

2. 1 intermediate leek between 200mm and 300mm (8" and 12")
3. 2 blanch leeks above (14")
4. Collection of 3 leeks - pot leek, blanch leek, intermediate leek.

**An annual trophy will be awarded for the best leek in show.**

5. **Salad Collection:** choose any 4 vegetables out of the following.

- a. Globe beetroot (3)
- b. Tomatoes (3)
- c. Golden ball turnip (2)
- d. Stump carrots (2)
- e. Cucumber (1)
- f. Potatoes (3)
- g. Peppers (3)
- h. Courgettes (3)
- i. Aubergines (3)
- j. Red onion (1)
- k. Lettuce (2)
- l. Bunch of radishes (10)
- m. Spring onions (10)

**The number shown in brackets, is the quantity needed of each chosen vegetable.**

6. 1 plate of 3 onions dressed
7. 1 plate of 3 onions dressed, not to exceed 100mm (4")
8. 1 heavy onion to be shown as grown
9. 1 plate of 3 complete garlic bulbs
10. 2 ears of sweetcorn as grown
11. 1 head of celery pink

12. 1 head of celery white
13. 1 cauliflower
14. 1 vegetable marrow
15. 2 long parsnips cut to 100mm (4") of foliage.
16. 1 summer turnip
17. 1 swede turnip
18. 3 stump carrots
19. 2 long carrots
20. 2 long beetroot
21. 3 globe beetroot
22. 1 red cabbage
23. 1 cabbage not red
24. 1 plate of 6 potatoes of one colour/variety
25. 1 plate of 6 pods runner beans
26. 1 plate of 6 French beans
27. 1 plate of 6 pods peas
28. 1 cucumber
29. 1 plate of 6 heritage/unusual variety tomatoes
30. 1 plate of tomatoes on the vine
31. 3 rhubarb sticks
32. **Collection of vegetables:** 6 different classes from: 1-3 and 6-31 arranged as a collection. **Please note:** Each collection must contain the same number of vegetables as stated in the classes above.

**Prize money for this class will be: 1<sup>st</sup> £50, 2<sup>nd</sup> £30, 3<sup>rd</sup> £20.**

## **Fruit Classes**

33. Apples, cooking, 1 plate of 3
34. Apples, dessert, 1 plate of 3
35. Soft fruit, 1 plate of 12
36. Stone fruit, 1 plate of 3
37. Pears, 1 plate of 3

## **Flower Classes**

38. 1 fuchsia any variety, shrub, bush or trailing in a pot not exceeding 175mm
39. 1 begonia flowering grown in a pot not exceeding 175mm (7") diameter
40. 1 flowering plant other than a fuchsia or begonia grown in a pot not exceeding 175mm (7") diameter
41. 1 plant grown specifically for foliage effect in a pot not exceeding 175mm (7") diameter
42. 1 vase of mixed flowers containing not less than 4 different cultivars arranged for front effect (can contain foliage)
43. 1 vase of 3 dahlia blooms, large, any colour, any variety.
44. 1 vase of 3 dahlia blooms, medium, any colour, any variety
45. 1 vase of 3 dahlia blooms, small and/ or miniature, any colour, any variety
46. 1 vase of 5 dahlia blooms, pompom, any colour, any variety
47. 1 vase of 3 gladioli, any colour, any variety
48. 1 vase of 3 chrysanthemum blooms, incurved, intermediate, or reflex - one or more varieties
49. 1 vase of 5 spray chrysanthemums, one or more varieties
50. 1 vase of 6 sweet peas, any colour, any variety
51. 1 vase of 3 roses, large flowered, any colour, any variety

52. 1 large, flowered rose, any colour, any variety
53. 1 bowl of mixed flowers arranged for all round effect
54. 1 vase/bowl of dahlias and/or chrysanthemums only

### **Novelty Classes**

55. Biggest pumpkin (measured by circumference)
56. Most laden stem/branch of fruit
57. Best Patio Planter
58. Most unusual variety of fruit or vegetable grown on an allotment
59. Best garden compost or leaf mould. Please bring 3 litres (7") pot of compost - display trays to be provided by individual exhibitors.
60. Longest single runner bean
61. Allotment or garden photograph up to A4 in size

### **62. Champion City Show Display**

A display of flowers and/or fruit and/or vegetables exhibited by an individual or Allotment Association to be staged in an area of 1.20m deep x 0.80m wide. Judged on quality, range, and presentation.

**Prize money for this class will be: 1st £100, 2nd £75, 3rd £50.**

An annual trophy will also be awarded for this class. Displays in class 62 must be contained within the space allowed or they may be disqualified.

### **6 years and Under**
